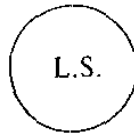

AN ACT to amend the Forests Ordinance.

[27th July, 1957.] Date of commencement.

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the National Assembly of Ghana in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Forests (Amendment) Act, 1957, and shall be read as one with the Forests Ordinance herein-after referred to as the Ordinance. Short title. Cap. 157.

(2) The Interpretation Ordinance shall apply for the interpretation of this Act as it applies for the interpretation of an Ordinance. Cap. 1.

2. Section 34 of the Ordinance is hereby amended by adding the following subsection as subsection (6) thereof:— Amendment of section 34 Cap. 157.

“(6) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, the Governor-General may, by notice published in the *Gazette*, declare that the power to make regulations under the provisions of paragraphs (1), (2) and (5) of subsection (1) of section 35 of this Ordinance shall extend and apply to any area of land constituted a Forest Reserve by bye-laws made by the appropriate local authority. Where any regulation made under the authority of this Ordinance is repugnant to any such bye-laws, the regulation shall prevail.”
